


Bodiam Castle

- Today you can visit the caste and climb to the top to see the views of the countryside

Dover Castle- England







Dover Castle

- Siutated on the white cliffs of Dover
- Walls have been modernized through time
- Has secret tunnels in which surprise attacks could be launched by soldiers
- Used during WWII as a command post for allied soldiers

Bothwell Castle

- Built in the 1200's
- 60ft high walls
- Once occupied by the English, it took Scottish men under the leadership of William Wallace to re-take the castle.
- It was later abandoned and no efforts were made to restore it until the late middle ages.

Edinburgh Castle-Scotland



Edinburgh

- This castle had been the home of all of Scotland's Kings and Queens. Each has made their own modifications to the original structure.
- Today it is part palace, fortress, chapel, barracks and war memorial.
- It can be toured today

Dublin Castle- Ireland






Dublin CAstle

Conwy Castle- Welsh







Conwy Castle

Avignon Castle-France






Avignon Castle

- Built in the 1300's
- Used by the popes during the middle ages
- A blend of French and Italian style

Neuschwanstein Castle-Germany





Neuschwanstein Castle

- Built by King Ludwig II in the late 1800's
- King Ludwig was obsessed with it's construction.
- Died before it was complete in 1886
- He is known as "Mad King Ludwig"
