

Battle of Coral Sea

May 1942

- American fleet intercepts a Japanese strike force en route to Port Moresby in New
 - Control of this base makes Australia an easy target
- New kind of naval warfare
 - Ships did not fire a single shot.
 - Instead they used their air wings to attack one another



Battle of Midway

- Japanese target Midway Island
 - 1,500 miles west of Hawaii

- Allied code breakers were able to find out the Japanese plans
 - Allowed Admiral Chester Nimitz, commander in chief of the U.S. Pacific fleet to get ready

Admiral Yamamoto

- Remember his goal after Doolittle Raid?
 - Do destroy all of the Pacific fleet's aircraft carriers


 Hopes this attack will draw out all of the ships from Pearl Harbor to defend the island.

June 4, 1942

- Nimitz sitting over the horizon allows the Japanese to start and attack on the island.
 - As the Japanese planes begin to take off...
 - American planes swoop in and attack while most of the planes are still sitting on the decks of the aircraft carriers.
- American's destroy 332 Japanese planes and ALL FOUR AIRCRAFT CARRIERS

We lose one aircraft carrier > USS Yorktown










Guadalcanal

- General MacArthur → Commander of allied land forces in the Pacific
 - Storming each island would take too long
 - "Island hop"- moving past Japanese strongholds and seizing island that were not well defended but closer to Japan
- Guadalcanal- first opportunity in Solomon Islands
 - August 7th, 1942- thousands of Marines land





Guadalcanal (cont.)

August 7th, 1942

- Japanese building huge airfield
 - Allies → strike fast to keep from it becoming a Japanese stronghold
- Trouble seizing the airfield
 - Extremely savage
- February 1943→ Six months of fighting end
- Japanese lose 24,000 out of 36,000 men
 - Became known as the "Island of Death"

Kamikazes

 Japanese tactic used after disastrous losses in the Battle of Leyte Gulf in October 1942.

Kamikaze

Japanese suicide pilots that would crash their planes into ships.



Iwo Jima March 1945



- 760 miles from Tokyo
- 2 months of bitter fighting
- Tunnels everywhere











One of the bloodiest battles of World War II.

Japanese losses → 100,000

American losses → 12,000
