
### Should you always support an ally?

### Alliance

• An alliance is an agreement made between two or more countries to give each other help if needed.



### Alliances

#### 1879 The Dual Alliance

Germany and Austria-Hungary make an alliance to protect themselves from Russia.



#### 1880 The Triple Alliance

Germany and Austria-Hungary make an alliance with Italy to stop Italy taking sides with Russia.



#### 1881 Austro-Serbian Alliance

Austria-Hungary makes an alliance with Serbia to prevent Russia gaining control of Serbia.

#### 1894 Franco-Russian Alliance

Russia allied with France to protect herself from Austria-Hungary and Germany.



#### 1904 Entente Cordiale

This was an agreement but not a formal alliance between Britain and France



# 1907 The Anglo-Russian Entente

Britain and Russia ended their differences with this alliance.

#### 1907 The Triple Entente

This alliance between Britain, France and Russia was made because of worsening relations between Germany and Russia and Germany and Britain

# The Triple Alliance

- Otto von Bismarck, chancellor of Germany, forms the triple alliance with Italy and Austria Hungary in 1880
- He also signed a treaty with Russia in 1881
- Kaiser Wilhelm II the new ruler of Germany in 1888, let the treaty with Russia lapse in 1890.
- Russia then forms a treaty with France.

# The Triple Entente

- An alliance between France, Britain, and Russia formed in 1907.
- It was formed because of worsening relations with Germany.

# Imperialism


• Imperialism is when a country takes over new lands or countries and makes them subject to their rule.

• Devotions to the interests or culture of one's own nation.











### Crisis in the Balkans

- Austria-Hungary opposes because they think it will stir rebellion among its Slavic population.









#### The Shot that sparks WWI

- Archduke Franz Ferdinand and his wife visit Sarajevo, the capitol of Bosnia on June 28, 1914.
- Both are shot by Gavrilo Princip, a member of the **Black Hand**, a Serbian Nationalist group.
- The Black Hand was a secret society committed to ridding Bosnia of Austrian Rule.



### Assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand









- Austria presents Serbia an ultimatum
- Serbia would not agree to all terms
- Austria rejected Serbia's offer and declared war on Serbia
- Russia enters the war to protect Serbia from Austria-Hungary



- Russia begins to mobilize troops to put on Germany's border
- Germany declares war on Russia, then France
- Great Britain declares war on Germany
